AIO - ALL IN ONE

Strengths

- Most like a disposable
- Requires no assembly
 - Easy to use
 - Usually a trim fit

Considerations

- More expensive type
- Need to wash the whole nappy after each use
 - Can take long to dry (depending on how the layers are sewn in)

HOW MANY? 24 AIOs to wash every second day* *A variety stash is recommended SIZE:

One-Size = 5+kg,

Newborn = 3-8kg

HOW MANY? 24 OS SIOs to wash every second day** **A variety stash is recommended

Strengths

- Easy to use, convenient
- Tends to give a trim fit*
- Requires minimal assembly, just snap in inserts
- Faster drying time than an AIO

Considerations

- Can have a hidden layer of waterproofing or outer PUL
- Need to wash the whole nappy after each use
- Takes a bit more time to match inserts with the correct cover (compared to an AIO)
 Expensive

SIZE:

One-Size (OS) = 5+kg, Newborn (nb) = 3-8kg* * Brand dependent



POCKET

HOW MANY? 24 OS pockets to wash every second day* * A variety stash is recommended

Strengths

- Widely available
 - Affordable
 - Quick drying
- Good for daycare as it's inexpensive and easy to use
- Can get a stay-dry or natural fibre pocket lining

Considerations

- Requires some effort: Adding inserts to pockets before use and removing before washing
- One or two pocket openings (Two means inserts agitate out when washing)
- Not an ideal option for night time cloth or nb cloth
- Wash entire nappy after each use

SIZE: One-Size (OS) = 5+kg, Newborn (nb) = 3-6kg*



A12 - ALL IN TWO

Strengths

- Can reuse the cover before washing by just wiping it and then replacing the insert
- Economical option as you need fewer covers (the expensive part)
 - Trim fit
 - Dries relatively quickly
 - Great for nappy bags and travelling as it takes less space

Considerations

- PUL might touch baby's skin at hips. Some might have a skin sensitivity to PUL
- Not ideal for newborn cloth due to runny poop (can't always reuse covers before washing)
- 2 step solution, snap in insert and then snap onto baby

HOW MANY?

- 24 inserts + 6 covers to wash every One-Size = 5+kg, second day*
- *A variety stash is recommended

SIZE:

Newborn = 3-8kg

Inserts = small <9kg, Large > 9kg or one-size*



HYBRID FITTED

Strengths

- Entire nappy is absorbent
 Most breathable type (Great when baby is teething or skin has a bit of
 - redness)
 - Beautiful and unique prints
 - Usually handmade

Considerations

- Has a water-resistant layer sewn in (hence breathable)
- Needs a cover for night-time cloth or long trips
 - Wide variety of quality
 - A bit bulky
 - Takes long to dry
 - Expensive

HOW MANY?

A full-time cloth stash needs 24 OS nappy changes and 36 nb nappy changes*

* We recommend a cloth nappy stash with a variety of types

SIZE:

One-Size (OS) = 5+kg, Newborn (nb) = 3-8kg Petite = 4-10kg *



FITTED

Generally used for nights or long trips so 4-5 should be enough to wash every second day*

*A full-time cloth stash needs 24 OS nappy changes and 36 nb nappy changes

Strengths

- No folding required
 - Very absorbent
- Good night-time option
 - Relatively easy to use
- Whole nappy is absorbent
 - Great newborn solution

Considerations

- Can be snapless or have snaps
 - Snapless is fastened with a snappy or pin
 - Needs a cover: PUL cover, Wool or fleece soaker
 - Can take longer to dry
 - Tends to be bulky

SIZE:

One-Size (OS) = 5+kg, Newborn (nb) = 3-8kgMedium <9kg, Large > 9kg*



PREFOLD

Strengths

- Very absorbent
- One of the cheapest options
 - Dries relatively quickly
- Versatile: can be used as boosters. inserts or snappied on baby
- Usually made from natural fibres
 - Great for newborn cloth

Considerations

- Can take a little bit of practice if using a snappy
 - Need different sizes for different ages
 - Old style cloth
 - Needs a cover

HOW MANY?

24 Prefolds and 6 covers for one-size stash. 36 Prefolds and 8 covers for newborn stash* *A variety stash is recommended

SIZE:

Small = 3-9kg**Large = 9-18kg**

FLAT

Strengths

- Very trim option (flannel or hemp)
 - Very absorbent
 - Dries very quickly
 - Cheapest option
 - Easy to handwash
- Great for holiday cloth, newborn cloth and night time cloth (2 flats)
 - Lots of different folds

Considerations

- Learning curve to fold and snap/pin on baby
 - Old style cloth
 - Needs a cover

HOW MANY?

24 Flats and 6 covers for one-size stash,

36 Flats and 8 covers for newborn stash*

*A variety stash is recommended

SIZE:

50x50cm/Newborn = 3-8kg


60x60cm/petite = 5-10kg

70x70cm/OS = 5+kg


